VI. OLD BUSINESS

A. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEM: Math Textbook Adoption – Big Math Ideas / Math I-III / Pre-Calculus
The Board was asked to consider the adoption of Big Ideas Math for grades 6-8, and Math I-III and PreCalculus for use beginning in the 2023-2024 academic year. Information was provided in the packet to
demonstrate continuity of curricular concepts over the span of middle and high school grades, and
community input. The last math curriculum adoption was in 2015. Materials were available for review in the

District Office and at the school sites by appointment.

B. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEM: Floral Design (CTE) Course and Textbook Adoption

Whereas our art classes at Sierra High School are currently impacted and our agriculture program is more focused towards mechanics and animal science; we believe it would be beneficial to offer a course that could alleviate the art department and expand our agriculture program into a new pathway. This course will be a hands-on project-based learning environment that will expose students to the principles of design as well as plant sciences and ornamental horticulture. After surveying students there is a high demand to add this course to our schedule. The course is A-G approved for art credit in another district which will assist in getting the designation for Sierra High, and offers students another opportunity to fulfill that requirement while also being enrolled in an agriculture class.
