Protocols for Staff Member Positive Cases and Exposures to COVID-19 *Updated 1/18/2022*

Any staff member who tests positive for COVID-19 must be quarantined for at least 5 days. The day symptoms start (or if you are not experiencing symptoms, the day a positive test is collected) is Day 0. Before returning to work you must seek a test on or after Day 5 if:

- You do not have, or no longer have, a fever;
- There is no cough, or if you had a cough, it is gone or nearly gone;
- > Other symptoms are not present, or are improved.

If you take a test on or after Day 5, and your test results are negative, you are to return to work on the following day.

If your results are positive, you must remain in at-home quarantine through ten days, returning to work on Day 11. We will not ask you to test on the days following—you can return to work without a second test on Day 11 (as long as there is no cough or fever present, and you generally feel better).

The district can provide an antigen test at no charge, please contact Teresa Page, Barbie Neu, or the LVN at your worksite to arrange a test. Register here.

It is more important than ever to wear a well-fitting mask around others, indoors or outdoors, but especially in indoor settings. During this quarantine time, you **must** wear a good mask (the

district is providing N95 masks, please ask for one!) for the entire 14 days to try to stop the transmission of the virus.

The decision to stay in-person vs distance learning is most likely to be based on our ability to keep students safe through adequate staffing. Please do everything you can to keep yourself and others from contracting COVID by employing all of the measures we have available to us:

Vaccination, including a booster once you are eligible;

Antigen testing;

Wearing a high quality mask;

Keeping physical distance from others – especially during lunch, as this is proving to be an especially good time for the virus to travel;

Handwashing and other sanitation measures.
